IMPORTANT: If a horse is staying overnight, an owner/agent must stay on premises. Permission from Tomora MUST be obtained first!

Entries:

Enter ONLINE: Entries may be made online <https://www.ringradar.com>. For assistance, please call the show manager or secretary.

An Entry is Complete when:

- A vaccination record (Equine Influenza Virus and Equine Herpes Virus “Rhinopneumonitis” (within 6 months of show date) must accompany each entry. (see USEF rule GR 845 for more information)
- ALL horses must have a negative Coggins test (valid within one year of show date).
- All out of state horses must have a 30-day health certificate as well as a copy of a negative Coggins test within the 12 months of the show date and vaccination record. Your health certificate will be checked at the office.
- The WDACO and facility liability forms must be signed by Rider/Owner/Trainer.
- All fees must be paid.

*All records should be uploaded to RingRadar.

All information must be received before entering show grounds. Thank You!

All grooms, family, assistants, etc., who will be on the show grounds during the show must sign the WDACO Liability Release when arriving at the venue.

Entries are accepted on a first-come, first-served basis, based on postmark/electronic submission date. Entries may be limited.

Late entries are accepted on a space-available basis and charged a \$30/entry late fee.

If the classes are oversubscribed, a “wait list” will be maintained. Horses will be moved into the show based on wait list order prior to scheduling. After the show has been timed, show secretary will work wait list horses into the show based on the best fit with the schedule. Management reserves the right to refuse any entry.

Refunds: Up to closing date, all fees refundable except office fee. From the day after closing to the day prior to competition, class fees will be refunded only if ride(s) can be filled from the waitlist. During the competition no refunds including ‘Acts of God’ will be issued. **Office fee is non-refundable.**

Awards: Ribbons to 5th place all classes (O, A, J, GO). Management reserves the right to break ties.

Class Information

We reserve the right to combine, split or cancel classes based on entries. **USEF/USDF Dressage Intro, Eventing tests (all), WD Intro, and WD Basic tests will be held in the small arena (20 m x 40 m). All other tests will be held in the large arena (20 m x 60 m). All tests will be ridden in the indoor arena.**

You may enter any class you wish. You may enter multiple classes; however, you cannot ride in two non-consecutive levels (i.e. Intro and Level 2). We recommend that you keep your entries to a maximum of four classes per day. ***Class schedule will not be in order of the class list but rather based on entries. Specific ride time(s) will be emailed to you before the show. Please make sure your entry is filled out legibly, especially your e-mail address so you can receive your ride times via email prior to the show.***

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Competition Rules

Adult Amateur Status: An adult (18 years of age & older) that does not meet the definition of a professional as defined by USEF rules.

Open Status: An adult (18 years of age & older) engaging in professional activities as defined by USEF rules.

Junior Status: Riders are eligible to compete as juniors if they are 17 years of age or less at the beginning of the 2025 competition year (December 1, 2025 - November 30, 2026).

Numbers: You will be provided with a bridle/halter number for each horse/rider combination. Horses must always have a bridle number attached.

Horses Not Competing: Non-competing horses must have their own entry for the show.

Attire and Equipment: An ASTM safety helmet is required for Juniors at all times when mounted. Proper footwear and shirts with sleeves and collar are required for all competitors. USEF rules and guidelines will be used for attire and equipment. For more information, please review the USEF rules applicable for each discipline.

Dogs: No dogs will be allowed on the premises.

Hazardous weather, Acts of God, Accident Policy: Management reserves the right to cancel any classes due to hazardous weather, Acts of God, accidents, or emergencies. Every effort will be made to reschedule. No refunds for cancellations due to hazardous weather, Acts of God, accidents, or emergencies.

Other: Every class offered herein which is covered by the rules and specifications of the current rules and of the current WDAA rules will be judged in accordance therewith.

Scheduling

Ride Conflicts: Competitors with multiple horses and horses with multiple riders are urged to bring enough help. If a conflict is discovered, notify the show secretary immediately.

Official Ride Times: *Acknowledgements:* Entries will be acknowledged via email upon receipt by the show secretary. *Provisional Ride Times:* Provisional ride times will be emailed. *Day Sheet:* Be certain to check the day sheet, which will be posted near the indoor arena.

Scores: Tests will be scored and posted outside the show office. It is the responsibility of the competitor to verify the accuracy of all scores. Scoring errors must be reported to the Show Secretary within one hour of the official posting of the scores from the last class of the show day.

Tests and ribbons are available after the class is completed. Please allow at least 30 minutes from the class's last ride time before sending a designated person to pick them up.

Facility Information

Stabling: Outdoor (covered) day stalls are available through Tomora Training Center (TTC). Shavings are not included. Please contact TTC directly: tomoratrainingcenter@gmail.com.

Arenas: The indoor arena will be available for hand walking prior to start of show. Other times as schedule permits. **NO LUNGEING IN THE INDOOR ARENA.**

Warm-up Arena: Warm up is a large sand arena located south of the Main Barn/Indoor/Parking area.

Lunging: Please use the Signed for Show use lunging pen.

Directions: Take I-25 to the Highway 34 exit. Proceed East approximately 3 miles. Go under the overpass for 10th Street/Windsor. Directly to the South you will see a large horse sign. Tomora Training Center entry is at the light/intersection of Hwy 34 Bypass and Promontory Parkway. Turn South, follow signs to Barns and parking.

Hwy 85 to Highway 34. Proceed West to the intersection of Hwy 34 and Promontory Parkway.

Parking: Parking for horse trailers at the large parking lot on the South side of the main barn and indoor arena. Cars – please do not take up trailer space; cars may be parked along the turnout paddocks or by the South warmup arena.
